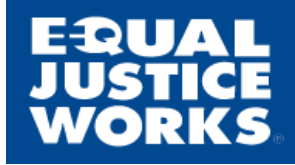


The 2L Guide to the Conference & Career Fair Guide



The Equal Justice Works Conference and Career Fair is the largest national public interest legal career fair in the country. More than 160 public interest employers conduct interviews for internships and full-time jobs and meet with students in informal “table talk” discussions of public interest legal opportunities. Over 1,200 students from nearly 200 law schools attend for interviews, workshops on public interest careers, job search advice, networking, resume and cover letter review, mock interviews, and more.

We believe that the poorest and most vulnerable among us deserve the same access to justice and quality legal representation as the privileged. October 1	Employers end the interview selection period.
October 7	Last day for students with accepted applications to sign up for an interview time.
